- ❖ DPZ next public meeting May 30 (same night as LM Conservancy) to discuss township zoning Presenting retail and commercial conceptual plan
- ❖ LM Clean up weekend approaching and 2nd one in 2 weeks
- Sanitary sewer rate will not increase this year
- Public works director is retiring soon
- School Board Challenge of Tax rate, judge noted roll back and will be heard again by Commonwealth Court
- ❖ Penn Wynne Elementary does not want to expand the school.
 - Need to consider solutions; discussions include redistricting
 - o Historically enrollment is cyclical
 - Turnover of housing with new buyers of school age children, greater use of public schools, existing apartments have school age children
- Primary Day May 15th
 - o LM is split and portion in District 5 of Delco and Soutwest Phila.
